## **BUSINESS AND STAFF REPORTS**

<u>Twin Lakes Road bridge project.</u> Newberry Township forwarded a Memorandum of Understanding to Jordan Good, the Warrington Township Engineer from C. S. Davidson who is working with them on the project. The Solicitor advised the Board that this MOU is more like a contract than a Memorandum of Understanding. The Board would like to set up a meeting with representatives from Newberry Township and Warrington Township to discuss unanswered questions within the MOU.

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<u>Wellsville Borough parade request.</u> The Borough is planning to hold an Annual Fall Festival and parade on October 28, 2017. They are requesting a donation for sponsorship from Warrington Township. There are three levels of sponsorship from \$100.00 up to \$250.00. Motion was made by Supervisor DeFrain and seconded by Supervisor Hawkins to approve a donation of \$250.00 to Wellsville Borough to help sponsor their Fall Festival. Motion carried unanimously.

<u>Lisburn Road-Yeager Road intersection.</u> A request was received from Northern School District to evaluate the intersection for a 4-way stop. The Board said it would need to evaluate the cost of a study and ordinance versus the need for a 4-way stop. The Manager was asked to respond to the district and ask if they were willing to pay for the costs.

<u>Crack sealing</u>. Daniel Kreig, Inc. quoted prices for crack sealing rentals. To rent the machine weekly is \$1,000. The Board requested that the Road Foreman prepare a list of roads that need cracks filled for them to review during the next meeting.

<u>West Shore Ambulance, Memorandum of Understanding.</u> West Shore Advanced Life Support Services shall be designated the primary provider of emergency medical services, advanced and basic, for all or for a portion of Warrington Township. Motion was made by Supervisor Dockery and seconded by Supervisor Hawkins to approve the memorandum of understanding. Motion carried unanimously.

<u>Curve Advisory Reporting Service</u>. Supervisor Calderone was selected for a free analysis of one curve in Warrington Township. He entered a drawing during the Township Conference in Hershey. The Board suggested that a curve on Poplar Road be chosen for the free evaluation.

<u>Poplar Road.</u> Supervisor Dockery said to notify the Road Crew that a stop sign at the intersection of Ridge Road and Poplar Road needs to be adjusted. It is posted at a 45 degree angle.

# ACCOUNTS PAYABLE

Motion was made by Supervisor Dockery and seconded by Supervisor Hawkins to approve General Fund accounts payable in the amount of \$68,316.31 and State Liquid Fuels accounts payable in the amount of \$437.18. Motion carried unanimously.
